CADY'S CORNER

Happy July Tri-Par Residents,

We get many questions about hooking the Direct TV boxes up to other Wi-Fi networks. In truth, it does not matter what network you are on. As long as you have a Wi-Fi network, you can hook the box up to your other television. Push the red reset button on the side of the box, then put in the new Wi-Fi network name and password and the channels should appear. If you are still getting Sarasota channels once you complete those steps, then go to: Setting, system, Device Preferences, Location status, and click use Wi-Fi to estimate location. You may need to power off or reset the box again to get those settings to start working. Another way to get to locals is to go through: Settings, preferences, locations settings, set new home location. Feel free to call the Tri-Par office for help.

A new awning is going over the storage area next to the flea market building. This will give the group a dry protected area to store items.

The success of the Health Fair in May has prompted the Park to schedule another one on January 24th when most of the Park residents are back. This should be an even bigger event than the last one with massages, yoga instruction, musical entertainment as well as many free raffles. RECIPE OF THE MONTH

American Pie

Celebrate the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, with fireworks, parades and food – everything red, white and blue!

Ingredients:

- 2 refrigerated pie crusts (unbaked) or your favorite pie dough recipe
- 5 cups of strawberries
- 3 cups of blueberries
- 1/2 cup cornstarch, divided
- 3/4 cup sugar, divided, (plus more for sprinkling)
- 1 lemon (zest and juice)
- 1 egg & 1 Tbs. heavy cream for egg wash

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 400°. Roll out dough to 15" x 12" and transfer to jellyroll pan. Fold

- edges and crimp. Refrigerate while preparing the other crust.
- 2. Roll out second piece of pie dough. Use ¼ of dough to cut out stars with small star cookie cutter. Use a paring knife and cut long 1-inch thick stripes lengthwise using the rest of the dough. Refrigerate until ready to use.
- 3. Make the fillings. In a medium bowl, add blueberries, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 cup cornstarch and the juice and zest of 1/2 lemon. Stir to combine. In a separate bowl add strawberries, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 cup of cornstarch and juice and zest of 1/2 lemon. Stir to combine.
- 4. Make the pie. Fold aluminum foil into a strip about 1½" wide. Fold the strip into a right angle about 5" x 4". Remove base crust from the fridge and place the foil into the upper lefthand corner to form a small rectangle. Spoon the blueberry filling into the foil-lined rectangular portion. Then spoon the strawberry filling into the rest of the crust. Remove the foil.
- 5. Assemble and bake. Place pastry stars on top of the blueberry mixture. Lay the stripes lengthwise across the strawberry filling leaving 1" between each stripe. Brush the egg wash onto the crusts and sprinkle with sugar. Bake 50 minutes. Let cool for an hour before serving.

KNOW THE RULES

State Laws

Florida Golf Cart Laws

Effective October 1, 2023, Chapter 2023-67, L.O.F. (CS/CS/HB 949) required that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must:

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver's license.

Sarasota County

Contracting/Licensed Contractors

Any new structure or improvements to an existing structure must be performed by a State of Florida or locally-registered Sarasota County contractor. Owner-builders can perform work with the applicable permit. To report suspected unlicensed contracting or activity, please call 941-861-5000 or Crime Stoppers at 941-366-TIPS (8477); you may remain anonymous.

ALERT Sarasota County --- REPLACES Code Red Warning System

Sarasota County has switched from Code RED to a new alert system for emergency alerts for items such as water main breaks, weather warnings, etc.

Sarasota County Code Highlights

- Junk, Trash and Debris: Prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to wood, tires, automobile parts, hazardous waste, abandoned property, unusable or discarded household items, inoperative or discarded machinery or equipment, motor vehicles and trailers, which are inoperative or lack current license tags, solid waste, construction or demolition materials.
- *Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles*: All vehicles must be operable and have current license tags or must be stored in a completely enclosed building.
- **Overweight Vehicles**: Parking, servicing repair and storage of trucks, buses, vans, and tractor trailers in excess of 6,000 pounds vehicle empty weight is prohibited in residential or open use districts.
- Living in Motor Homes or RVs in Residential Areas: It shall not be used for living, sleeping, housekeeping or business purposes and shall not be hooked to any utilities.
- **Building Permits**: Before the start of any construction or structural repair, check with the County permitting Office (861-6678) to ensure if a permit is required.

- Household Garbage and Yard Waste: All waste must be in trash cans, plastic bags or tied bundles, weighing no more than 40 pounds. Put containers out no sooner than 5 pm on the day before pickup (Sunday) and remove them by 10 am the day after (Tuesday). All containers are to be stored inside or rear yards only. You must separate yard waste from solid waste.
- **Household Hazardous Waste**: Except for motor oil and filters, hazardous waste is not collected at the curb. You must bring these types of items to a collection center, neighborhood collection or community collection program for proper disposal.
- Appliances: Residents may call the Tri-Par Scrap Pickers (Flea Market) to schedule a pick-up for an appliance or scrap metal. Please call Brad at 617-548-3343 for pick up.

Call the Sarasota Call Center (all violations) at 941-861-5000 or Code Enforcement at 941-861-6403 to report a violation of these codes.

Recycling

We are all aware of the need to cut down on our trash and the impact it has on our environment. Some activities you can undertake to reduce the impact of the waste you produce:

Waste Prevention: Avoid buying more than you need. Print only documents and emails that must be legally stored in paper form.

Waste Reduction: Avoid products with excessive packaging. Buy loose vegetables instead of pre-packed goods.

Reuse: Repurpose plastic bags. Find creative ways to transform used containers into home storage bins.

Recycle: We are all recycling in our homes, but sometimes find we are attending or running meetings or social events where the building does not have recycling facilities. (Such as our Tri-Par Clubhouse) Club leaders can arrange to have cardboard items, pop cans and steel cans taken home so that these articles can be recycled

Dogs and Cats

Sarasota County Ordinance Chapter 14 contains the regulations concerning pets and other animals. These regulations contribute to the well-being of the pets in our community and, therefore, to the well-being of us all.

- Each year you must obtain a license certificate and tag for your dog or cat. In order to receive the license, your
 pet must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The official county license may be attached
 to a collar or harness and must be worn by a dog or cat at all times.
- Your dog or cat may not run at large on any public property or the property of another and must be under the
 direct control of a responsible person. Direct control always means immediate and continuous physical control
 of an animal (dog or cat) by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal.
- Under no circumstances shall a person improperly tether any animal. It is unlawful to tether an animal
 outdoors, except when all 10 conditions (listed in Sarasota County Code of Ordinances, Section 14-35) are met.
 The most important condition is, "The Animal is in visual range of the Owner, and the Owner is located outside
 with the Animal."
- There have been instances when individuals are frightened by the behavior of our animals. If this occurs to you or you observe anything listed above, please report the incident to Animal Services at 941-861-9500.

F.I.S.H. Transportation (Free Medical Transportation)

Free medical transportation (via automobile) for Sarasota residents only. Donations are accepted. Rides available in the Sarasota area only. Transportation is for medical appointments only. MUST call to schedule 48 hours ahead and appointments must be between 9 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Phone: 941-953-5838

Tri-Par Policies and Procedures

Background Check for New Owners, Renters, or Caregivers and Guests Who Stay More Than 30 Days

Background checks are required for all first-time buyers, renters, or caregivers in Tri-Par Estates. A background check is also required for first-time guests staying more than 30 days. Renters, caregivers, and guests who have left the Park for 12 months or more must reapply for a background check. A per person application form and per person \$50.00 fee must be submitted to the Tri-Par Office a minimum of 30 days prior to the desired occupancy date for processing and the Board's action. The new application form is available in the Office.

Board Approval is Required Before Moving into Tri-Par Estates

If a renter, buyer, or caregiver moves in without the Board's prior approval, the first action will be to start the process to assess a fine against the owner in accordance with Section 22 of our deed restrictions. Secondly, unapproved renters or owners will be required to vacate the property and leave the park. If they refuse and it becomes necessary for legal action to remove the unapproved occupant(s), the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to recover all costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees (Section 21 of Deed Restrictions) from the property owner.

Use of Tri-Par Pool and Spa

Adult supervision is required for children under 12 years of age when at all areas of the Pool. No one under 16 is permitted in the Spa. Pool and Spa rules are posted at the pool area.

Speed Limit in Tri-Par

The speed limit throughout our Park is 20 MPH. We have many walkers, bikers, and people on their golf carts every day. For the safety of all our residents, please do your part in observing the speed limit. If you have guests, let them know we would very much appreciate their maintaining the 20 MPH speed limit within the Park.
